The River Sweep is an annual cleanup for the Ohio River and its tributaries. The event encompasses more than 3,000 miles of shoreline from Pittsburgh to Illinois. Since 1989, this award-winning cleanup brings thousands of volunteers to the riverbanks to collect tons of trash and debris. Duck Hollow in Squirrel Hill is an official River Sweep site on the North Bank of the Monongahela River. Volunteers are needed.

What should I wear and/or bring to the River Sweep? Wear old, comfortable clothes and shoes or boots that you won't mind getting dirty. Closed-toe shoes are also recommended. Wear long sleeves and long pants. Trash bags and gloves will be provided. Bring your own gloves if you have a favorite pair.

Please be advised that cleanup sites events may be rescheduled or postponed due to high river levels, so please check with the River Sweep coordinator for your area before attending.



Rails-to-Trails Greenway Sojourn Returns to the Great Allegheny Passage

Last summer, the SVTC received a mini grant to replace the delineators along East Waterfront Drive's contraflow bike lane. 



Wig Room - The JMD Cancer Resource
Center Wig Room has been an invaluable

In consideration of being permitted to participate in the "Wheels of Hope,"

(The Activity), I for myself, my personal representatives, assigns, heirs, and

Next of kin do hereby acknowledge, understand and agree to the following:

- 1. I am qualified, in good health, and in proper physical condition to participate in The Activity.
- 2. The Activity will be conducted over public roads, trails and facilities open to the public where hazards can be expected, including the danger of collision with pedestrians, motor vehicles, other riders and fixed or moving objects; the danger of road surface hazards including metal bridges, expansion joints, drain grates and painted lines that are particularly hazardous when wet; and also including weather conditions, inadequate safety equipment. I agree and warrant that if at any time I believe conditions are unsafe, I will immediately discontinue further participation in The Activity.
- 3. Helmets are required for all riders 12 and under that participate in The Activity.
- 4. Bicycling activities involve Risks and Dangers of Serious Bodily Injury, including Permanent Disability, Paralysis, and Death, with accompanying risks of economic loss. I hereby release and discharge the JMD Board of Directors, JMD Staff, all event Volunteers, other participants, Sponsors and Donors and owners and leasers of the premises on which The Activity takes place (Releasees) from all Liability, Claims, Demands, Losses, or Damages I may incur in connection with The Activity. I hereby Release, Discharge Releasees from liability for any such injuries or damages Caused or Alleged to be Caused in whole or in part by the Negligence of the Releasees, including Negligent Rescue Operations; and I further agree that if, despite this release and waiver of liability, Assumption of Risk, and Indemnity Agreement I, or anyone on my behalf, makes a claim against any of the releases, I will indemnify, Save, and Hold Harmless Each of the releasees from any litigation expenses, attorney fees, loss, liability, damage, or cost which may incur as the result of such claim.
